Principal's Report

The main theme of our activities during this particular year has been the completion of much of our millennium building programme. The technical and crafts centre, comprising new rooms for Construction Studies, Materials Technology Wood, Technical Drawing, two rooms for Home Economics and external storage facilities went into use at the end of August 2001. There had been a delay due to moisture problems in the floor of the building but heroic work by all concerned ensured that we were using the facilities as soon as possible.

The new boys' changing rooms were also commissioned at the end of August and now provide spacious, modern, bright facilities with two shower rooms and plenty of storage room. As you read this, the pavilion and music centre have been completed and will be in use within the next week, after the October half-term. The pavilion provides a lengthy balcony from which two rugby pitches, the main cricket pitch and the athletics track can be viewed, as well as a large entertainment room with tea-making facilities and an entrance into the new committee room which can be used as an extended hospitality area when necessary. The music centre has a concert performance room which will also be used as a classroom, an additional classroom, individual instrument tuition rooms and the committee room mentioned above which can be used by the music teachers as an additional space when required, for example, to house recording and sound mixing facilities. Throughout the buildings, the emphasis in decor has been on the use of bright, attractive and varied colours to provide a motivational and enjoyable environment for the pupils and staff. In addition, our school art collection will continue to expand with new works being hung in the new buildings as time goes on.

Beneath the music centre is a new archive area to house the archives of the school and of the Erasmus Smith Trust which owns the school. Trust archives date back to about 1650 and will provide a research resource for scholars and school pupils when they are efficiently available from the new archive facility.

The space which has been released in the main school buildings as a result of these new facilities is being reused in a variety of ways. Two new classrooms have been created and a language listening resource centre has been installed. In addition, Form 6 have warmly welcomed the new Form 6 centre. This area is on ground floor level and has been furnished with lounge style seating, raised cafe style round tables and stools, work tables and a variety of food and drink preparation equipment. Form 6 pupils have elected a committee to take responsibility for the operation of the centre. The bicycle storage area has also been refurbished and modernised. It has been equipped with a wire mesh front so that it is visible at all times from the school office.

These magnificent new facilities have been augmented by the construction of our

millennium commemorative garden in the central courtyard of the school. The area has been attractively paved with setts and circular raised flower beds have been planted, as well as border beds around the edge of the garden. Seating has been installed and the students of the National College of Art and Design have been commissioned to provide a central sculpture which is being funded by the Parents' Association. The school has had long links with NCAD, with art education students being trained here annually by Mrs Larkin, co-ordinator of our art department.

The committee in the school which supervised the building programme was the Grounds & Property Committee of the Board of Governors. On behalf of the whole school community, I would particularly like to thank this committee, chaired by Dr J. Reid, the Administrator Mr J. Davis, the design team, the contractors and everybody who was and continues to be involved in the project.

School review, evaluation, planning and development take place on a continuous basis, both formally and informally. This year a great deal of our energy has gone into the planing and construction of the buildings mentioned above. Additionally, new courses at Leaving Certificate level are being introduced on a phased basis in Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Home Economics. There is also ongoing training being provided in Social, Personal & Health Education, English, Civic, Social and Political Education and the Transition Year programme. The new Religious Education syllabus is in operation on a pilot basis in the junior cycle. Pupils who wish to undertake the subject as a Junior Certificate examination will be required to complete additional work to that covered in class. In-career training requires teachers to be absent from school on certain days but is extremely valuable.

The work of the committees of the Board of Governors is a vital part of the long term planning process undertaken in the school. The Education Committee has continued to guide the review of the educational process. Among its concerns during the year has been the review of the school uniform and school planning processes. The Sports Committee has further reviewed the provision of staff and resources for sport within the school and has agreed a new structure with the staff.

The school council is a very valuable body which is elected directly by all of the pupils, conducts its own meetings and then meets with the school management and staff representatives in order to ensure that pupils have the opportunity to contribute to school planning and processes. Last year, the council facilitated the invitation of Eoin Ryan, T.D. to the school to hear the concerns of the pupils with regard to industrial action being undertaken by the Association of Secondary Teachers of Ireland. The council was also instrumental in the consultative process which led to changes in the school uniform.

Our programme of visiting clergy and speakers to morning assembly continues to be successful. We are very grateful to the dozens of speakers who agreed to visit us. Pupils, staff and the Principal also participate. Our assembly programme is designed to provide an opportunity when the whole school can reflect on spiritual, moral, social and ethical themes. In addition, we celebrate the achievements of individual pupils and

teams by congratulating them in assembly. It is an important vehicle for assisting the development of pupils' characters and values.

The contribution of the Parents' Association to the school is greatly appreciated. We are fortunate to have one of the most active associations of any school. Members now (among other things) assist the Guidance Department with mock interviews, facilitate the parties which are held to celebrate the graduation of Form 6 and the receipt of Junior Certificate results by Form 4, organise the parent-teacher meetings in Forms 1, 2 and 5, meet with the Principal and Chairman of the Board to discuss school policies, organise evening meetings for parents on educational themes, fund some of the prizes as well as grants for exchanges, and represent the parents on all Board committees and ad hoc committees. During the year the committee organised a lecture on substance abuse by Des Corrigan of the Pharmacy Department of TCD, as part of the school's normal programme of raising awareness of social issues which concern parents. This work brings the parents, pupils and staff closer together and such a vibrant and enthusiastic association is a testament to the strong ongoing support for the school among parents.

The school is grateful to the Past Pupils' Union for its continued financial support, through prizes and bursaries as well as special fund-raising projects. Although much of this work is unseen, it is certainly appreciated. An online network exists on the school website at www.highschoolublin.com so that past pupils can register their e-mail addresses by year of graduation, thus keeping in touch with their peers and enabling the school to keep in touch with them.

Staff

Mr Derek Cole retired at the end of the school year, having taught Mathematics at the school since 1963. Mr Cole made a major contribution to rugby coaching and to the administration of rugby over many years. We would like to wish him well in his retirement. Mrs Marjorie Travers has also left us as co-ordinator of the Religious Education department, having taught here since 1988. We wish her the best in her new career. Ms Anita Wilson, Mr Timothy Gill and Ms Ann Corrigan are taking career breaks this year and we wish them well, hoping to see them back again in the future. Ms Olivia Harvey and Mr Simon Moore have left us after one year and we wish them well in their new jobs.

This year we are pleased to welcome as new teachers Miss Becky Galligan (Art), Miss Audrey Barnett (Science, Biology), Ms Sinead Toolan (Science, Biology, Home Economics), Miss Karen Hennessy (Irish, Mathematics, French), Mrs Norma McGrath (Irish, CSPE), Ms Aingéal Ni Chonchubhair (Irish), Mrs Shuna Hutchinson-Edgar (co-ordinator of Religious Education), Mr Brian O'Hanlon (Geography), Miss Rhonda Jenkinson (Business, French), Mr Roger Elvin (French, History), Miss Grace Fitzgerald (English, History). During the year, we have also welcomed Mrs Vivienne Barry as accountant.

Numbers and Examinations

The number of pupils enrolled in the school for the year 2001-2002 is 787. In the Leaving Certificate Examination, 2001, 118 pupils presented 821 papers in 21 subjects. 549 papers were taken at higher level and grade C or better was obtained in 74% of these.

Grade E or less was obtained on 3% of all papers.

In the Junior Certificate 131 pupils presented 1213 papers. 850 papers were taken at higher level and grade C or better was obtained in 84% of these. Grade E or less was obtained on 2% of all papers.

Events and Activities

Some of the activities of the year were curtailed due to foot and mouth disease and days lost due to industrial action but it is still gratifying to see how much actually took place. We were pleased to hear of the success of Nicholas Nash in winning a gold medal in the computer programming Olympiad, resulting in a trip to Finland for him. 1W and 1S classes were involved in preparing a time capsule with their teachers, Mr J. Ryan and Miss P. Graham, for insertion into the ceiling of the new Technical and Crafts Centre. The European Studies programme has continued, with ongoing contact between The High School and schools in Belfast and Derry at senior and junior level.

As usual, many educational and field trips took place (foot and mouth disease permitting), including a language tour to Barcelona, a ski trip to Finland, a visit by Form 6 to the Higher Options Conference, caving trips to a number of locations, English department trips to drama productions, a rugby trip to Canada, and a biology field trip to Ardkill bog. Transition Year activities included trips to the Irish Film Centre and Mountjoy Gaol, a Dublin Corporation Road Safety Drama, orienteering outings to Marlay Park, a photography project for Age Awareness.

The Library is large by school standards, with almost 12,000 volumes and multi-media computer facilities. A group of pupils assists our full time librarian, Mrs King, with the organisation of charity fund-raising, displays and competitions.

The Guidance Department is run by a qualified guidance counsellor. There is a guidance course offered in Forms 4 and 5 with individual career interviews for pupils in Form 6. Form 4 pupils undertake differential aptitude tests and interest inventories to assist them to make subject choices for the Leaving Certificate. They also study the operation of third level education and the opportunities available. Students are encouraged to begin thinking about potential career areas, to use work experience as a time to focus on future pathways, to consider possible college applications and to prepare accordingly. Students in Form 5 attend a variety of career talks held in the school, carry out a career project, visit UCD open day and familiarise themselves with relevant college websites and career related computer programs such as Qualifax. Students are also advised on curriculum vitae, job applications and interview technique. We are grateful to the Parents' Association for its assistance with the organisation of a mock interview evening. Mr McClure organises a study technique course for Form 5. Form 6 students attend the Higher Options Career Exhibition, the TCD open day as well as selecting other college open days of particular interest to individuals. Advice is given to students on college applications and this year the counsellor organised a CAO information evening for parents. The guidance counsellor is available to parents and pupils by prior appointment for career and psychological advice.

We are pleased to maintain our link with the Centre for Talented Youth in Ireland (based

at Dublin City University). At least ten of our pupils qualified to attend a residential course held under the auspices of CTYI, after sitting a Scholastic Aptitude Test.

Unfortunately for our Music Department, the Inter Schools Music Festival was cancelled this year due to foot and mouth disease. The orchestra and choir's performances at Prize Day and the Carol Service were greatly appreciated by those present. The musicians of the orchestra also performed in a summer concert which was a very enjoyable showcase for their talents.

The Drama Society presented the musical "Little Shop of Horrors" in November. The acting, choreography and lively music were greatly enjoyed by the audiences. The society also entered "Bittersweet Me" in the one act play competition run by St Andrew's College. Junior drama club took place weekly and its members staged "While Victoria Lay Sleeping". Transition Year pupils staged two excellent variety shows in January and in May while the various rock bands in the school participated in the Battle of the Bands competition which has now become an annual fixture. We were pleased to hear during the year that Luke Slott and Jonathan Black, previous participants in this competition had won the national competition and been offered a recording contract with Sony. Six pupils received school art awards and their paintings and photographs were added to the school art collection.

The Debating Society organised many debates and discussions, at both senior and junior levels. Among the topics discussed were the actions of multinationals and the effect of globalisation on Africa. Five pupils participated in the European Youth Parliament regional selection conference and Cuan Ó'Seireadáin represented Ireland in Stockholm at the International Youth Parliament.

The staff and pupils of the school are always involved in raising funds for a wide variety of charitable causes and this year was no exception. Among the projects were the Library Committee's collections for the Irish Cancer Society and the Cottage Home for Little Children. The profits of the Valentine's Day Post were donated to ISANDS. Transition Year and fifth year pupils organised a mammoth collection of Christmas presents for children in Eastern Europe from this school and from local primary schools under the "Operation Christmas Child" umbrella. They collected 960 boxes and £2,500. Transition Year pupils also sold Santa Bears for the Central Remedial Clinic, sold holly for the ISPC and organised a non-uniform day for Clann Óg (for homeless young people). Food parcels were collected for the Simon Community at Christmas. 3G organised a fund-raising soccer tournament in aid of Focus Ireland.

The President's Award (Gaisce) involves undertaking a period of community involvement, physical recreation, the development of a personal skill and a venture project. The community involvement could comprise, for example, working every week with Oxfam, in a nursing home or organising football training for young children. It is not an easy challenge, entailing 15 weeks of community work and 26 weeks of skill development, but those who undertake it experience great satisfaction and fulfilment. Thirty-one pupils completed the bronze challenge.

Sport

The 1st XV rugby team had a very good season, progressing to the quarter finals of the league, winning their first cup match against Gonzaga and finally winning the Leinster plate competition (Fr. Hampson Cup). The JCT also had a good season, winning two cup matches against St. Patrick's Navan and CUS but eventually going out to Terenure. While this report concentrates on the major teams due to pressure of space there were also many other teams at senior, junior, U 14 and U 13 level which had good, enjoyable seasons.

The 1st XI girls' hockey team defeated St Gerard's in a replay of the second round of the cup competition but went out to Loreto Beaufort after a brave performance. The Minor A and B teams both progressed to the quarter final of the league while the 1st year A team remained unbeaten throughout the year. In boys' hockey, the 1st XI defeated King's Hospital, St Killian's and Wilson's Hospital in the league, drew with Wesley College and went out of the cup to St Columba's.

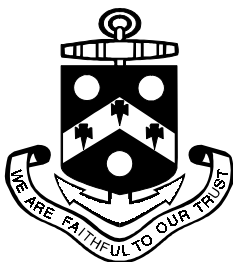
Many of the competitive cricket fixtures were affected by the reduction in size of our pitch, due to building work, but the senior team were victorious over St Columba's. The JCT defeated Wilson's Hospital, Terenure and St Mary's, reaching the final where they were defeated by a very strong Belvedere team. Teams were also fielded at Under 14 and Under 13 levels. The senior girls' cricket team reached the semi-final where they were defeated by Alexandra College. The school fielded boys' and girls' tennis teams.

The cross country runners had an enjoyable season, with strong performances in the league season from Sharon Johnson, Claire Fry, Nadine Grunitz, Holly Warren, Seán Ó hÉigearthaigh, Gavin Coleman and Colm Dowds. At the East Leinster athletics championships Ros Campbell won gold in the shot and Owen Wardell silver in the intermediate mile. Ros repeated her gold at the Leinster finals.

Hillwalkers visited Glendalough, Mullaghcleevaun, Tonelagee, Djouce, Lugnaquilla and undertook some night walks. Caving, basketball, soccer and rock-climbing were also enjoyed by those who participated. Swimming continued on a weekly basis with nine pupils completing the ASA swimming challenge. Pupils participated in canoeing on a regular basis and eight completed level 2 kayak proficiency awards.

More detail on all school activities is available in our yearbook The Erasmian and Diocesan Times, an excellent publication which is produced by Form 5 pupils under the co-ordination of Mr T. Gill. I would like to congratulate and thank the many staff who give up their time to encourage so many enthusiastic pupils in their pursuit of extra-curricular activities. These experiences add greatly to the enrichment of the pupils' educational experience.
